Dr. Gopi Upreti is an *Emeritus* Professor at Tribhuvan University (TU), Nepal, with more than three decades of distinguished service in teaching, research, and academic leadership. He has held senior academic and institutional roles, including Chief Commissioner of the Nepal Agriculture Research Council (NARC) and Strategic Policy Advisor to the Environmental Protection Council (EPC), Government of Nepal. His scholarship spans agriculture, environmental science, conservation, and sustainable development, and includes more than 100 peer-reviewed journal articles, review papers, books, and book chapters. An East-West Center Doctoral Fellow at the University of Hawaii (1988–1992), Prof. Upreti earned a BSc in Agriculture (Hons.) from Punjab Agricultural University, India, and MS degrees from the University of Hawaii in Agriculture and Environmental Resource Management.

His landmark 1994 paper, “*Environmental Conservation and Sustainable Development Require a New Development Approach*,” received the *Best Paper Award* from the International Foundation of Environmental Conservation and established him as a notable *global voice in environmental thought and policy*. He is the author of ground breaking book *Ecosociocentrism: The Earth First Paradigm for Sustainable Living* (Springer Nature, 2023) and the eco-philosophical poetic Epic *From Ruin to Renewal: A Poetic Epic of Ecological Awakening* (STAR Scholars Press, 2025). His contributions have been recognized by the STAR Scholars Network through the *North Star Medal of Noam Chomsky Lifetime Achievement Award* (2024), appointment as *Environmental and Climate Policy Laureate* (2025).

Beyond academia, Dr. Upreti is a committed advocate of secular humanism. He is a life member of the American Humanist Association, a member of the International Council of Secular Humanism, an advisory-board member of *The New Encyclopedia of Unbelief* (Prometheus Books), and founder-editor of the English magazine *Humanist Voice*, as well as founding President of the Humanist Association of Nepal (HUMAN). He continues to write and speak internationally on environmental sustainability, sustainable development, humanism, ecological justice, and pathways from the *Anthropocene* to a regenerative *Symbiocene*.
